Murray, age 65, unexpectedly passed away on Saturday, September 8, 2018. He was a native of Kenner and a 32-year resident of Ponchatoula. Murray served four years in the United States Marine Corps, having honorably defended his country during the Vietnam War. He also proudly served as a Kenner Police Officer for many years, and later became one of the best safety supervisors in his company. Murray was an avid deer hunter and would usually be found dressed in camo. He was a well-liked and loved baseball coach and umpire, who helped revive and reestablish the Dixie Youth, Minors, and Majors Program in Ponchatoula. Murray adored his family more than anything and always made sure to say 'I love you' before he left for work, no matter the time or place. He was an honorable and kind family man that is already deeply missed by all who knew and loved him.

He played on our squadron's football team and we also played basketball at lunch in the hangar bay. Murray was a competitive son of a gun. I recall fondly a football game we played in a downpour. Murray was a running back and when he was tackled, he came out of the pile and his glasses were full of mud. He could not see a damn thing, but he was grinning from ear to ear. Murray and I talked on the phone only a few weeks before this tragic accident. He was so excited that he may be coming to Philadelphia for his job. Where he was going was only about 20 minutes from my house and I was also excited to see him. Unfortunately, the work assignment changed and he was going to Montana. When we talked, he always, and I mean always, told me what a wonderful family he had and he was just so proud of them. I had not seen Murray since 1973, but when we talked on the phone, it was as if we were together the previous day. I always followed his Facebook page and he loved to post photos of his family. I can only imagine your pain in losing Murray. I will never forget him.
