Bruce William White went to live with his Lord, August 3, 2022, at the age of 75 at the PAM Rehabilitation Hospital in Covington, Louisiana surrounded by his loving family.

Bruce was born November 26, 1946, at Camden, New Jersey and was a resident of Holden Louisiana.

Bruce was a veteran of the United States Navy where he served for 22 years serving as a photographer. After retirement, he continued in the photography business.

Bruce is a member of Bethlehem Baptist Church Albany, Louisiana and was previously a member of the Whitesburg Baptist Church, Huntsville, Alabama where he played in the orchestra for 26 years.

Bruce's favorite pastime was fishing and collecting antique lures. He was never happier than when sitting in a boat fishing with his son Dale and nephew Bill.

Bruce is survived by his wife of 54 years, Velma Jane Methvien White, son Clinton Dale White, Holden Louisiana; brother John White (Babeth) Houston, Texas: numerous brother and sisters-in-laws and many nieces and nephews. Bruce was preceded in death by an infant daughter, Amanda Nikki White, his parents William and Margaret Paxon White, and sister Margaret (Peggy) White.

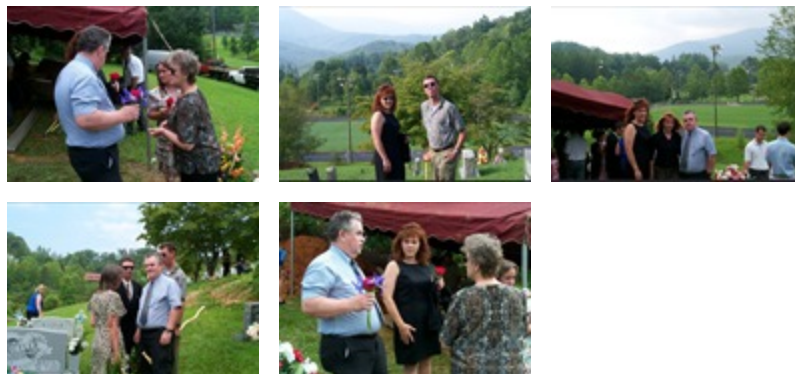

“ My first memory of Bruce was the first time I met him. He was shooting a wedding in 2001 for a family member and I took the first digital camera I ever owned and was shadowing him taking pictures of the wedding party and family members. It was one of Kodak's new digital cameras, and it had a very strange lens system. Bruce gave me some strange looks when I pulled it out of my bag, but he never said anything. One of the things that sticks out in my mind was that during him shooting the wedding pictures, instead of him saying, "Hey get out of my way, I'm trying to shoot this wedding," he actually stopped and took the time to say, "Hey, if you do this you will get a better picture and, "If you do that you will get a better picture." He let me shadow him and take all the photos I wanted to. I thought that was really great of him. He even handed me his film camera and asked if I minded snapping a few pictures of him with his family and the wedding party. Bruce taking the time to share his knowledge was who he was and what he did. He would get excited about sharing his knowledge with other people like my granddaughter Natalie who is 14 and got into photography a few years ago. He got excited about that and brought her backdrops and old film cameras the last time he visited with us Mother's Day weekend. He even drove over to Southerlands and bought her a book about photography. He saw hundreds of her photos and said she really had an eye for it and would give her constructive criticism that she was thankful to learn. Those are the things that I loved about Bruce.
