



Gladys Short Cashio

October 31, 1920 - May 30, 2018

Gladys Laurie Short Cashio, sister Gladys to many, of Loranger, Louisiana, was called home from a very restless night in early morning of May 30, 2018, to meet the perfect peace of her Lord and Savior, in the presence of her daughter and a sister and nursing staff at Landmark Nursing center in Hammond. Gladys moved with her parents and nine other siblings to Louisiana in 1936 and, except for a short time back in Alabama, she made Louisiana her home, having moved to Hammond, LA in the early 1950s. Gladys was born in Opp, Covington County, Alabama, on October 31, 1920, to Ada Ward and Zoner Franklin Short, the second of 16 siblings. She was a 'war-time bride' of Sam Joseph Cashio, all who predeceased her. To that union with Sam was born her only daughter, Billie Jean Cashio Theriot-Reeves.

Her first love was to The Lord Jesus Christ and her devotion to Him and her family were the trademarks of her life. She spent many years nursing babies and the sick and elderly, after which time she worked in a sewing factory and 'took in' sewing at home. But mostly she served the Lord. Family members and friends were always welcome to her cozy home and bountiful table. Gladys journaled all her life, and it was her modesty that probably kept her from writing her own obituary, but she would want you to know how important people in her life were to her. She loved everyone, and most especially her dear Billie, Billie's husbands, Harvey Theriot (1936-1996), Billie's second husband Sonny Reeves, Billie's two daughters, Terri and Paula and her

grandchildren.

In addition to her daughter and sons-in-law, Gladys is survived by her granddaughters, Terri (Duane) Flynn, and Paula (Frank) Allbright of Loranger, LA; her 6 great-grandchildren, Justin, Lacey, Llana, and Jolee Flynn, and Chloe and Jude Allbright.
