



## Harvey Taylor

February 19, 1926 - February 28, 2010

Age 84, a native of Covington and longtime resident of Pumpkin Center, Harvey passed away on Sunday, February 28, 2010 at Willis-Knighton Medical Center in Shreveport. He was a U.S. Army Veteran and was a longtime deacon of Trinity Baptist Church. Mr. Harvey was married to the late Joyce Taylor, a founding member of Trinity Baptist Church, until her death on June 26, 1998. He was also the owner and operator of Taylor's TV Repair Service in Ponchatoula for 40 years until his retirement in 1992.

He is survived by his two daughters, Sheila Plaisance and husband Roy, Arlene Portier and husband Guy; son, David Taylor and wife Karen, along with six grandchildren, Crystal, Amanda, Rachael, April, Christopher and Sarah. He is also survived by his sister, Betty Sue Taylor.
