



Dr. Hiram Garwood Haynie Jr.

April 18, 1926 - January 9, 2017

Hiram Garwood Haynie Jr., M.D., a resident of Louisiana for more than fifty years and recent resident of Springfield, age 90 years, passed away on Monday, January 9th, 2017, surrounded by loved ones and friends. He grew up in Abilene, Texas, and served in the Navy during World War II. He graduated from Sewanee, the University of the South in Tennessee, and from Tulane Medical School, practicing psychiatry until his retirement in 2003. He lived most of his life in New Orleans, on the Northshore, and in McComb, Mississippi. Dr. Haynie had a private practice until late in his career when he served as the medical director at Rosenblum Mental Health Center in Hammond. His colleagues have always commented on his ability to convey empathy to his patients.

He was one of the most ethical people imaginable, but was not religious. He always described himself as a liberal Democrat and was a strong believer in good government, protecting the environment, and making life better for those who struggle. He loved the beauty of the American West and of Orange Beach, Alabama, and throughout his life he enjoyed a range of hobbies, including bridge, fishing, golf, gardening, watching the Weather Channel, and voracious reading of news and non-fiction.

He is survived by his beloved wife of 21 years, Evelyn Troyo Haynie; his loving children, Cassandra "Sandi" Haynie, Laurel Hickman and her husband John,

Lucerne "Cerni" Currie and her husband Sam, Suzanne "Sudi" Haynie, Lisle Goeldner and her husband Brad, and Alan Haynie and his wife Elizabeth Gay; his devoted grandchildren, Natalie, Cassie, Jack, Brynn, Brandon, Erin, Nick, Towner, Cameron, Lauren, Elias, and Stella; his great-grandson Nathaniel; his stepdaughter Glynda Sauviac; and his step-grandson Paul Michael Labruzzo. He was preceded in death by his parents, Lucerne "Ludi" and Hiram Haynie, and by an infant daughter, Cassandra Lucerne Haynie.
