Joann was born on July 14, 1933 in Wadesboro, Louisiana to Alvin Frank Flanagan Sr. and Clara Mathilda Hauck Flanagan. Listening to Joann talk, one would come to realize that she had a wonderful childhood. Fond memories spanned from Palmyra Street of old New Orleans mid-city area to her grandparents' strawberry farm near Rosaryville just west of Ponchatoula. Joann loved her parents dearly and reflected fondly often of her grandparents, especially her grandmothers, Rosetta Flanagan and Mathilda "Grandma Tillie" Hauck.

While growing up, Joann was active in the Rainbow Girls organization and attended Hammond schools. Prior to graduating high school, she was swept away by her local sweetheart Huey P. Leon Beyl, as they were married on December 25, 1950.
