Michael E. Page, age 67, passed away on May 2, 2021. They miss how he would show his children how to plant and maintain the garden, bass fishing and how to hunt, showing them how to ride a bike and teaching them to play sports. If there is one thing we want our dad remembered for - it is his selfless acts of kindness and his huge heart when it came to others. He knew what it meant to be poor and he made sure his work ethic was second to none. He would sometimes put in 12-16 hr days to get ahead in life. He inherited those traits from his mom, and she made sure to instill those values in him at an early age. He was constantly making himself available to others that needed a leg up. They can remember If there is one motto or quote he lived by, it was this "Every day is a second chance – So make the most of it."

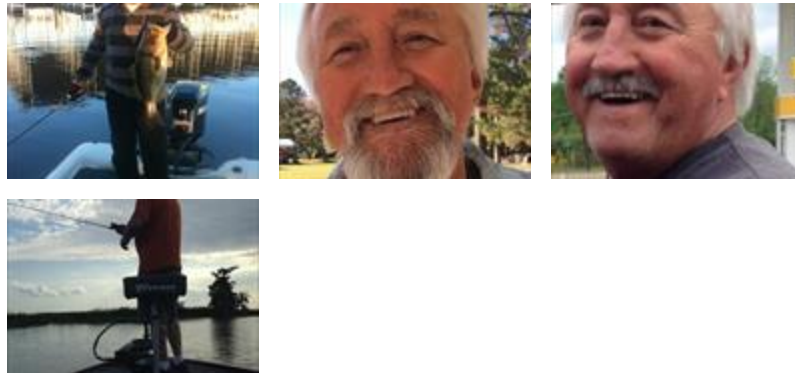
