Sherry Tomlinson Collura (March 10, 1947 – May 7, 2026), a longtime resident of Ponchatoula, Louisiana, passed away peacefully at home on May 7, 2026, after a courageous battle with pancreatic cancer.

Sherry, the daughter of W. H. and Margaret (Shields) Tomlinson spent her early years in Starkville, Mississippi, graduating from Starkville High School in 1965. After graduation from high school, Sherry enrolled in the Gilfoy School of Nursing in Jackson, Mississippi, where she later earned her degree and was licensed as a Registered Nurse.
