He was known for his appreciation of suspenders to keep his pants from slipping and a hat to keep the top of his head from getting sunburned once he started going bald. :) And some of his hats were quite unique, particularly one straw hat he wore outside with feathers he stuck in it for decoration. He liked to think of himself as eccentric.

Dad often did things to help people but tried to keep from drawing any attention to this. He didn't want to receive accolades but was pleased to see when he could make a difference in someone's life. This was true for members of his family, friends and acquaintances. He will be remembered as a kind and caring man with a wonderful sense of humor.

Dad graduated from Charity Hospital in New Orleans' Radiology Tech program in 1963. He worked as an X-ray tech at several hospitals over the years, but spent the last years of his career at Hammond State School and loved working with the residents there who were developmentally challenged. During his adult life, he almost always held at least two jobs. He was trained as a real estate agent and held a broker's license for many years. He worked very hard to ensure that his family was always provided for.

His children and grandchildren remember riding in his truck meant hearing some life lessons or "Herschelisms" as they call them (Herschel was his middle name). If you were in his truck long enough, you were bound to hear the words, "Far be it from me to tell you what to do, But..." He loved taking the grandkids with him to get a new goat or other animal for the farm. And he loved giving tractor rides or just watching his grandkids play or pick vegetables or fruits that he and Mom (Doris) planted. When they had the farm outside of Amite, he really enjoyed hosting family reunions or any
